*The Wine*

The 2017 Black's Station Chardonnay shows beautiful aromas of stone fruit, brown sugar, toast and cream followed by broad flavors of melon, custard and sweet fruit. This Yolo County Chardonnay has a rich mouthfeel and a finish that lingers with a hint of oak. Pair this easy drinking wine with spit-roasted chicken, fish tacos or a big Greek salad.

*The Story*

Due east of Napa, tucked away in northern California's rolling Dunnigan Hills, is a little town called Zamora. But back in the late 1800's, folks around here used to call it Black's Station. At its height, this hub founded by J.J. Black boasted a hotel, two stores, a jail, blacksmith shops and a town hall. Today we grow our grapes in Zamora. We like to think that they carry with them the character and frontier-style of that old town.
